Individual Services

Cardiopulmonary

The basic cost for investigation of a routine cardiac or respiratory case is approximately: £500 - £2,000.

This includes an appropriate selection of the following: consultation, routine haematology and biochemistry profile, cardiac biomarkers, electrocardiography, Holter analysis, thoracic radiography, echocardiography, bronchoscopy, bronchoalveolar lavage, CT, airway sample cytology and culture and sensitivity.

Dermatology

The basic cost for the initial work up of a dermatological case varies depending on the complexity of the problem and the likely tests, procedures and treatments. These would be discussed at the initial consultation.

Initial investigation of itchy dogs, cats and horses: £500-750

Initial investigation of hair loss: £400-600

Initial investigation of ulcers, nodules and crusts: £450-650

Initial investigation and treatment of chronic external and/or middle ear disease (anaesthetic, CT scan, ear flush,

myringotomy, cytology & culture) - £1500-1750 Hair plucks, skin scrapes or cytology: £30 each

Intradermal allergen test with up to 53 allergens - £250-300

Allergen specific immunotherapy (including sub-lingual) induction: £180 - £250 Allergen specific immunotherapy (including sub-lingual) maintenance: £100 - £180

Video otoscopy, ear flush and myringotomy: £500-600

Laser treatments and surgery: £300 - £1000 Laser foot surgery (podoplasty): £750 - £1000

Skin biopsy: £250-300

Many skin conditions are on-going and require lifelong treatment. This adds to the overall cost, but we will discuss the costs of different treatment options with clients to help them make the best decision for their animal.

Exotics

Treatment prices range from approximately: £400 - £3,500

Rabbit dental treatment: £350 - £550

Diagnostic work up for sick exotic pet: £550 - £1,700

Longer term in patients (medical) with diagnostics and treatment: £1,100 - £2,700 Complex surgical cases including diagnostics and critical care: £1,300 - £3,300

Internal Medicine

Treatment prices range from approximately: £750 - £3,700.

Investigation of chronic diarrhoea: £750 - £2,000 Investigation of chronic anaemia: £750 - £2,500

Investigation of pyrexia of unknown origin: £1,300 - £3,500

Treatment of hyperthyroidism by radioactive iodine: £1,900 - £3,000

Treatments can range up to £6,200 depending on the complexity of the case.

Interventional Radiology

Treatment prices range from approximately: £1,700 - £7,500

Urethral stent: £1,900 - £3,600

Laser lithotripsy for urinary stones, ureteral stent: £2,300 - £4,600

Urethral collagen injection for incontinence, laser ablation of ectopic ureters or transjugular coil embolization IHPSS:

£4,100 - £7,500

Chemoembolization: £2,400 - £4,700 Tracheal stent: £1,900 - £2,500

Nasopharyngeal balloon/stent: £1,600 - £10,000 Oesophageal/colonic stents: £2,200 - £3,000

Treatment prices for cardiac interventional procedures range from £3,500 to £5,000 excl. cardiac work-up.

Pacemaker implantation: £5,000 Balloon valvuloplasty: £3,500 PDA amplatzer: £3,500

iHPSS coil embolization: from £4,400

Oncology

Treatment prices range from approximately: £800 - £7,000.

Cancer staging: £500 - £2,000

Multidrug therapy for Lymphoma: £3,000 - £5,000

Chemotherapy: £1,800 - £4,600

Definitive radiation therapy: £4,000 - £7,000 Palliative radiation therapy: £1,500 - £3,500

Treatments can cost more depending on the complexity of the case.

Orthopaedics

Treatment prices range from approximately: £1,000 - £7,000.

Cranial cruciate ligament disease: £1,800 - £3,900

Medial patella luxation: £2,000- £3,000 Fracture repair: £1,500 - £4,500 Total hip replacement: £5,500 - £7,000

Developmental elbow disease: £1,300 - £3,700

Arthroscopic treatment of joint disease: £2,000 - £3,500

Spinal decompression: £3,500 - £5,000

Advanced Imaging: CT from £730 / MRI from £900

Neurology and Neurosurgery

Investigation and initial treatment of epilepsy and suspected intracranial neoplasia £2,000 - £3,000

Investigation and initial treatment of meningoencephalitis/meningomyelitis £2,500 - £2,900

Investigation and treatment of generalized neuromuscular conditions (in. nerve and muscle biopsies) £1,000 - £2,800

Surgical treatment of intervertebral disc disease and spinal neoplasia (inc.diagnostic imaging) £3,500 - £5,000

Decompressive brain surgeries for intracranial neoplasia, brain trauma or treatment of syringohydromyelia £3,500 - £5,000

Placement of ventriculoperitoneal shunt for hydrocephalus £3,500 - £5,000

Soft Tissue Surgery

Treatment Prices Range From Approximately: £700 - £7,500.

Perineal herniorrharphy: £2,500 - £3,500 Laryngeal tie-back: £1,500 - £4,000

Brachycephalic airway surgery (without tracheostomy): £2,000 - £4,000

Abdominal surgery simple, canine (e.g. enterotomy/enterectomy): £2,500 - £5,000

Abdominal surgery complex, canine (e.g. septic peritonitis) £3,000 - £7,500

Gastric dilatation and volvulus (simple): £2,500 - £5,000

Portosystemic shunt: £2,500 - £4,500

Total ear canal ablation: £2,500 - £3,500

Wound management: phone for estimate

Reconstructive surgery: phone for estimate

Laparoscopic bitch spay: from £400-500

Physiotherapy and Hydrotherapy

Treatment Prices Range From Approximately: £45 - £105 per treatment

Physiotherapy only - from £45

Physiotherapy and Hydrotherapy – from £75

Please note that an estimated cost of treatment will be provided by the attending veterinary surgeon upon consultation

<u>If your pet is insured</u>: please bring an insurance claim form to your appointment with the relevant sections completed and signed. Payment of your policy excess is required on the day of your consultation; please check your policy to see what this amount is. It is also advisable to check your policy limit for veterinary fees cover and exclusions.

<u>If your pet is not insured</u>: a 50% deposit of the upper estimated treatment cost is required. In all cases, payment is required upon discharge of your pet.
