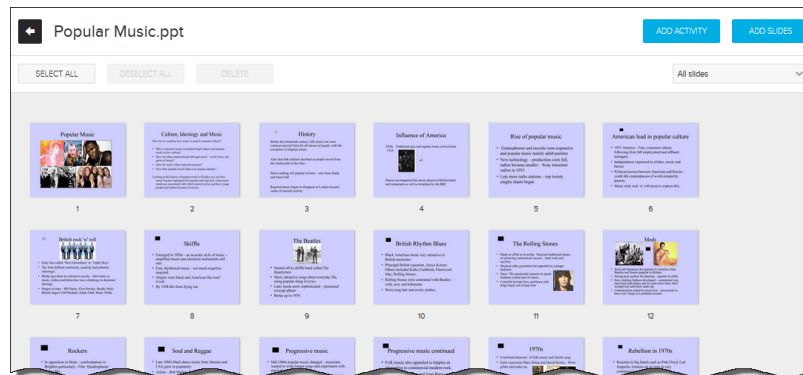
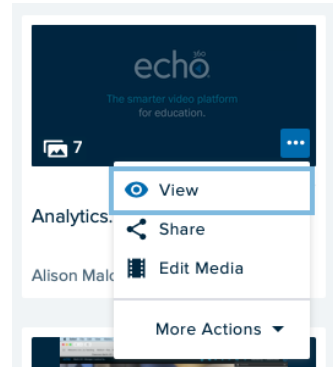


# Adding Activity Slides to a Presentation

As part of the engagement tools available in Media Hopper Replay it is possible to add activity slides to a presentation. There are five interactive activities that can be added in this way: multiple choice, short answer, image quiz, ordered list and numerical

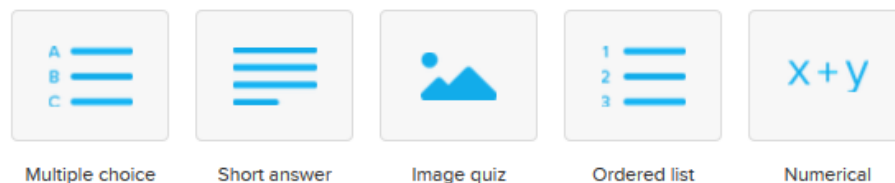
## Part One: Navigating to the presentation

1. Click on the **Echo360** logo to take you to your Homepage;
2. Click on **My Content** from the left-hand menu to see your presentations;
3. Select the presentation you wish to add the interactive activity to. NOTE: You can type the name of the presentation into the search bar if you cannot immediately see it;
4. Click on the 3 dots that appear to reveal the drop-down list;
5. Click on **Edit Media** and your slides will be shown.



## Part Two: Adding an interactive activity

1. Click **ADD ACTIVITY**;
2. You will then be presented with a choice of the 5 available activity types

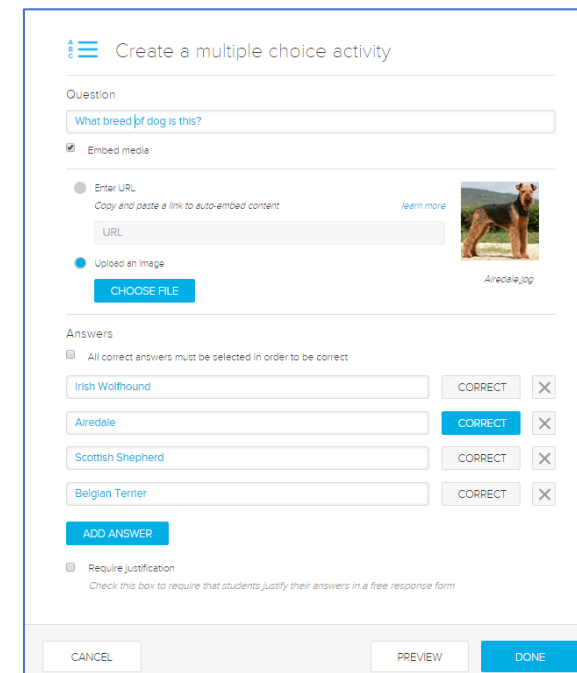


## Multiple Choice

You can add multiple choice activities to a presentation. You enter the question and a list of possible answer choices, then mark which answer is correct and whether that answer requires justification. Students click an answer and enter a justification into a text box if required.

To add a Multiple Choice question:

1. Select the **Multiple choice** icon;
2. Enter the question. You can enter up to 1000 characters.
3. If you wish to embed media, **enable the checkbox** to upload an image or enter a URL.
4. Add the answer options and designate the correct answer(s) by clicking on the **correct** box to the right of the answer(s)
5. You can enable the **Require justification tab** so that students must elaborate on their answers
6. You can click **PREVIEW** to see the students view of the activity
7. Click **Done**



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
## Short Answer

You can add short answer activities to a presentation. You specify the question and the student enters their answer into a text box.

To create a short answer activity:

1. Select the **Short answer** icon;
2. Enter the question – This can be up to 1,000 characters in length;
3. Click **Preview**, if you wish to see the student view;
4. Click **Done**.

NOTE: Student responses will allow up to 60,000 characters





## Image Quiz

You can add image quiz activities to a presentation by uploading an image, entering a question, and then marking the solution. When students interact with you during a lecture, they indicate the correct answer to your question by clicking the image.


To create an image quiz activity:

1. Select the **Image quiz** icon;
2. Enter the question – This can be up to 1,000 characters in length;
3. Click **Choose image** to select the image you wish to use;

2. You can enable **Require justification**, if needed;

## Ordered List

You can add ordered list activities to a presentation. Students respond to your question by putting a list of responses in the correct order.

To create an ordered list activity:

1. Select the **Ordered list** icon;
2. Enter the question – This can be up to 1,000 characters in length;
3. Enable **Has a correct answer** and Media Hopper Replay will randomise the order in the student view;
4. You can enable **Require justification**, if needed;
5. Click **Done**.

## Numerical

You can add numerical activities to a presentation. Students indicate the correct answer by entering the correct value or a value that falls within the correct range of values.

To create a numerical activity:

1. Select the **Numerical** icon;
2. Enter the question – This can be up to 1,000 characters in length;
3. Enter a **value** or **range of acceptable values**;
4. You can enable **Require justification**, if needed;
5. Click **Done**.
